

#### The Sphere Magazine: Future Plans

Everything has been different for everyone in 2020 and production of **The Sphere** has been no exception. It is edited, printed, collated and distributed by a small group of willing volunteers and the last printed edition was produced for April 2020. This was as usual done in the vestry of Alfrick Church (a process that can take up to five mornings). Collation, collection and delivery just scraped past the first lockdown deadline, after which the church had to be closed, later only to be open for private prayer on Wednesdays and Sundays (including services) for limited hours.

Subsequent editions have been placed on websites in each parish for subscribers, where possible, to download. Back copies can be found at <u>www.alfrickandlulsley.org/community</u> <u>www.leighandbransford.org.uk</u> and <u>www.suckley.org.uk/</u>

A questionnaire was circulated via most distributors to establish whether subscribers would be willing, or indeed would prefer, to receive copies emailed to them. About 150 of our 800 subscribers preferred this option, perhaps to minimise the impact on the environment of producing hard copies. We realise however that many of our loyal subscribers do not have the facilities or the ability/inclination to follow the internet route and of course many of them much prefer to have a hard copy at hand to refer to (especially for events and advertisements). Regarding advertisers, we have not been charging them since April 2020 as we have been uncertain as to how many readers would be viewing online,



although this appears to have grown to something over 500 views on the websites for October 2020 plus 160 sent by email.

We have had this Christmas edition (combined December/January) printed for us by outside printers and it will also be on the local websites. However this is much more expensive than printing it ourselves although has the advantage of better reproduction of photographs (but still in grey-scale). We are looking into the possibilities of upgrading our duplicating machine and are hoping to have the next printed version produced for the Easter edition (April 2021) if necessary having it again from outside printers. Meanwhile the website and email versions will still be produced (and in the future for those who prefer to receive their Sphere that way). If possible we would then like to return to printed versions each month (and anticipate resuming charging our advertisers from April 2021). We would expect to return to charging all annual subscribers (including for copies by email) in July 2021 when they will have received the eleven printed editions paid for in 2020.




in the good, in the disappointments and the difficulties, in sorrow and in celebration.

#### Our District Councillors' "View from the Hills"

What a year this has been. We hope sincerely like no other in our lifetimes. Although Malvern Hills is far less affected by the pandemic than much of the UK, MHDC is still planning for considerable increases in unemployment, homelessness and health issues as we move into 2021. As I write a possible vaccine is being heralded, but the effects of COVID will not be stilled for many months.

MHDC is, of course, continuing to supply basic services as best as possible. Rubbish will continue to be picked up. Planning services (and debates!) proceed. Daily life does go on, perhaps lacking sparkle, but hopefully with a sense of purpose. 

CHRISTMAS GREETINGS FROM THE TRUSTEES OF THE LEIGH AND BRANSFORD MEMORIAL HALL

2020, as we all know, will be remembered forever as the year of the Covid-19 worldwide pandemic and the sudden sea change it brought about to our way of life. Significant world events do that – they irrevocably change (or end) our lives, our behaviours and our futures. But they also give us opportunities to learn, remember, adapt, reshape and rebuild whether that's as a nation, a business, a family, an individual or a local community. And our parish ancestors, from their experience of world events also knew that.

#### We should also remember that 2020 was Leigh and Bransford Memorial Hall's centenary year.

The Hall was opened in 1920, not just as a community meeting place but also, and perhaps more importantly, as a lasting memorial to all those courageous men and women, young and old from the parish who served in the First World War (and later, those who served in subsequent conflicts). Like Covid-19, but in different ways, the Great War changed our parish ancestors' lives forever. Then, when the war ended their response was to build what is now our Memorial Hall. Their vision was to create an enduring legacy – a community building that would acknowledge the past by honouring personal sacrifice, but would also look forward to playing a part in a brighter future for parishioners – celebrating a return to greater public freedom and prosperity. What is even more remarkable, after the financial hardship all had endured, is that the Hall was built entirely from funds raised by public subscription – almost every household contributed in addition to a number of generous donations from certain individuals living in the parish.

So, as we prepare for what is expected to be a very different Christmas time for us all this year, let's take a moment to reflect on the powerful symbolism we see in the shape of our Memorial Hall. It has thrived as an enduring symbol of hope and triumph over adversity for 100 years – and is currently surviving the ongoing financial uncertainties brought about by covid-19. However we eventually manage to celebrate the meaning of Christmas this year, let's not forget the enduring gift our parish ancestors gave us 100 years ago – a gift that continues to provide a safe, warm and welcoming communal meeting space for your leisure and learning activities – whatever our 'new normal' future may hold.

Finally, lockdown permitting, we are still planning to hold what has now become our annual CAROLS ROUND THE TREE event – appropriate social distancing measures will be in place. Do come along and join us outside the Hall on SUNDAY, 20 DECEMBER from 4.00pm until 5.30pm – but you will need to book! FURTHER DETAILS about this *outdoor event* are on *Rev Anne's* page in this edition.

As I sit down to write a roundup of parish council news for 2020 it is, as it has been for everyone this year, a story of plans cancelled, lives turned upside down, meetings held virtually and efforts focused on helping the community and especially those most vulnerable, through this most challenging of times. We are very pleased that some schemes have gone ahead as planned. The project to enhance **Rectory Wo**od in Bransford is now complete. On the Wednesday before the latest lockdown a small group of parishioners spent the morning planting 2,000 native bulbs in the wood, including snowdrops, daffodils, wood anemones, bluebells and wild garlic. The Parish Council is grateful to those who volunteered for the planting. The wood will look beautiful in the spring and be a great asset for the local area for years to come.

The upgrading of **Leigh Hurst play area** has also been completed, with a range of exciting new equipment provided using S106 money from *Malvern Hills District Council*, allocated from the latest housing development in Bransford. The play corner is open for use by parents and children who are asked to observe the conditions displayed at the entrance to the play corner to ensure safe use during the ongoing pandemic.

But as we approach what is likely to be a very different kind of Christmas and the end of a year of unprecedented change and uncertainty, it is starting to feel as though hope is on the horizon. As I write, hopes for a vaccine that will allow us to return to something like the lives we took for granted before 2020 seem to grow as every day goes by. And there is hope, also, that the spirit that saw people come together as communities and rise to challenges previously unimagined will leave us stronger and more connected to each other than before – some good, at least, to come out of this bleak and difficult year.

After the Civil War, when Oliver Cromwell and his Puritans abolished Christmas celebrations (amongst other things), Christmas was just another working day and nobody wished each other Happy Christmas because it wasn't! Even the restoration of the Monarchy didn't help matters and by the early 19<sup>th</sup> century, the burgeoning industrial revolution was taking over. A lot of villagers had moved to the towns and cities. Industrial output was the prime consideration and it seemed that the rural Twelve Days of Christmas celebrations would soon be confined to history. Then, in 1843, A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens was published and, although he was hoping that Christmas might return to the more joyful times that his forebears had known, what he really wanted was to turn a profit from his book. So, to publicise the book, he gave readings of his tale, sometimes for charity, but usually for a fee for himself. But so many people were touched by the story and by his 'gift of the gab', that some of the factory owners decided that perhaps they should shut their premises on

Christmas Day and give their workers the day off to be with family and friends!

As a child, Dickens' life had been bleak. He'd worked in Warren's boot-blacking factory and his own parents were never as family-minded as the Cratchits. Ironically, through this best-seller and his subsequent writings, he became as rich as his hero, Ebenezer Scrooge. All the money he made turned him into a passionate champion of the poor, campaigning for changes to the child labour laws and improvements to the conditions in the workhouses. A Christmas Carol really caught on, as did the Christmas celebrations that he had written about. No longer did people work on the day itself, but the return to a twelve-day party was not to be achieved until our own recent times (that is pre-Covid!) But people could, and did, spend Christmas Eve and Christmas Day with their families, and they could also find time to spread a little goodwill among the poorer people of the towns. So, who saved Christmas? Why, Ebenezer Scrooge of course!






#### COVID CORNER December 2020: Good news at last, but not in time for Christmas

At last there is good news to report, and some light at the end of the tunnel. The press release from Pfizer that their mRNA COVID-19 vaccine is 90% effective is really good news. It appears to be effective across a wide spectrum of people. What we do not know yet is how long the benefit will last. There is a chance that some people in the UK (starting with front line health care workers and the most vulnerable) may receive this vaccine before the end of the year, but for the most of us this may not take place until the spring, and the UK has not purchased enough doses for everyone. However, this is not the only mRNA vaccine being developed, and other conventional vaccines are also coming along rapidly. At the time of writing we are in second lockdown for 4 weeks, but we do not know what the rules are going to be after that in the run-up to Christmas. Although the science behind those political decisions is clear, the decisions themselves do not necessarily follow the science. An example of this was "Eat out to help out" which helped the economy while contributing to between 8 and 17% of new COVID-19 cases, which was predictable. I am still amazed to see photos of waiters wearing just face-shields which direct exhaled particles down onto the food or drink they are carrying. Looking at the excellent COVID-19 Zoe app (which I recommend all of you to download and use to report daily along with 4.3 million others in the UK) we can see a downturn in numbers of new cases which is most encouraging, and may be an early indication that regulations will be

significantly eased post lockdown. Whatever the political decisions are going to be for this Christmas, it is helpful just to think through what you are going to be doing based on the science as well as the advice from Government.



At Christmas families across generations meet together indoors for prolonged periods of time and this is the perfect opportunity for the virus to transmit. Younger family members may well be carrying the virus but be totally asymptomatic. The oldest family members are those who are most vulnerable to this virus, and if they catch it they may need hospitalisation, ventilation, or may die. This virus is SO easy to catch that it is almost certain that it would be caught in such situations if a family member were carrying the virus. We do not have tests readily available to check whether someone we are going to meet has the virus, and we cannot rely on lack of symptoms to be sure that it is safe to mix with grandparents.

There will be other Christmases to enjoy being together, but if Grandad or Grandma catch this virus this may be their last Christmas. Anne and I have decided to meet our family "virtually" over Christmas and not to meet together in person. There will be other opportunities later on when both the vaccine and better therapies will enable us to do so safely. We will then celebrate with that bottle of bubbly. It will have been worth the wait, and hopefully that wait will not be too long.

#### News from Suckley Parish Council Zoom Meeting: 9 November 2020

**COUNTY COUNCILLOR:** Co Cllr Paul Tuthill reported to the meeting. The Fire Service was preparing to operate in the second phase of Covid which would cover three areas – delivery of PPE, acting as a standby to drive ambulances and dealing with the aftermath of a higher number of deaths if other services became overwhelmed. He acknowledged the problems with the high number of blocked drains in Suckley Parish, which was also a problem in other rural areas.

A high level meeting to address this problem was planned.

**DISTRICT COUNCILLOR:** Dist Cllr Sarah Rouse reported to the meeting. The District Council was now back into a Covid lockdown situation. As in the previous lockdown, community support was the key, and the Council was trying to build a community strategy. *Track & Trace* had now moved back down to a local level. The District Council was supporting school meals funding and local Food Banks. Despite the problems, the *Splash* was still being re-vamped. She was pleased to report that a resident survey revealed that the majority of residents felt that the Council was good value for money

**COMMUNITY: Remembrance Service** - Cllr P Whatley reported that a very much scaled down Remembrance Service to comply with Covid regulations would be held at the Old Quarry Memorial site on 11 November. **Parish Information Pack:** ClIr A Lewis reported that through the *Crowdfunding* project £423.91p had been raised. 500 folders had now been printed, and she was collating the information to go into the folders.

**PLAYING FIELD:** Cllr C Luton reported that a security gate had now been fitted across the Pavilion door. There had been an increase in the use of the Playing Field by football teams, with two teams per night on Mon/Tues/Wed and one team on a Thursday. Unfortunately people had removed posts to get onto the Playing Field, and she was considering erecting a post and rail fence to stop this happening.

**SUCKLEY CHURCH:** Cllr A Lewis reported that it was still planned to hold the *Tree of Light Festival* as usual, but with social distancing. The new space in the Church was also helping the school to set up Covid "Bubbles."

#### **Christmas Customs**

Christmas has its own customs, perhaps the most popular of which is going to Midnight Mass, or the Christ-Mas. This is the only Mass of the year which is allowed to start after sunset. In Catholic countries such as Spain, Italy and Poland, Midnight Mass is in fact the most important church service of the entire Christmas season and many people, traditionally, fast beforehand. In other countries, such as Belgium and



Denmark, people dine during the evening, and then go on to the Midnight Service. The English are behind some countries when it comes to exchanging presents. In Germany, Sweden and Portugal the custom is to exchange on Christmas Eve. However, the English are ahead of Serbia and Slovakia, where the Christmas tree is not even brought into the house and decorated until Christmas Eve. Yule logs are not so popular since the decline of the fireplace, but traditionally it was lit on Christmas Eve from a bit of the previous year's log, and then would be burned non-stop until 12th Night (6th January). Tradition also decreed that any greenery such as holly, ivy or mistletoe must wait until Christmas Eve before bringing it into the house.

It is one of the largest Christmas information websites on the web and was launched 20 years ago by James Cooper – a selfconfessed 'Christmas Nut', and Christian. However, there is now a wide variety of fun and interesting content suitable for both adults and children. Sections include Christmas Traditions and Customs, Christmas around the World, The Christmas Story and Christmas Fun and Activities. #### **Recent Activities on Alfrick Parish Council Land**



You may have noticed activity around the perimeter of the playing field at Alfrick. Following on from contractors clearing ditches and cutting hedges, about twelve

volunteers spent an afternoon planting a hedge around two sides of the field. Because this is a community project, the plants were supplied free of charge by The Woodland Trust and include around a dozen different native species such as hazel, blackthorn, silver birch, crab apple and willow. It is widely recognised that hedges support up to 80% of our woodland birds, 50% of our mammals and 30% of our butterflies. They enable wildlife to move through the countryside, protect soils from wind erosion and provide shelter for people and livestock, habitats for pollinators and assist drainage. The planting is not complete, but the lockdown has put a stop to the work. We hope to be able to complete planting by the end of the year. The parish council recently contracted an arboriculturist to carry out an inspection of the

trees for which it is responsible, namely those around the playing field and those in the spinney. We've received a report which indicates that most of the trees are in good health and little needs to be done now. Because we have been concentrating on the playing field there has been only one working party in the spinney during which we made a start on laying a path using wood mulch kindly provided by Nick Denley. The broken fencing between spinney and meadow has been replaced and a gate included to get equipment into the spinney should the need arise. We are also mindful that the Pound at Alfrick Pound needs a lot more attention: that work came to an abrupt end because of the rain last winter followed by the March lockdown. We don't usually work during the summer months because of the possible impact on wildlife. Covid-19 permitting, there will be further working parties through the winter. Because of the fast-moving Covid-19 situation they will probably have to be arranged at short notice so please contact Derek or Carol on 01886 884372 if you'd like to join us. #### **Swallow Report 2020**

This proved to be another bad year with the lowest number of adults and chicks recorded since the study started in 1998! At all the sites in Alfrick and the edge of Leigh only 25 adults were monitored and just 79 chicks ringed. Overall there were 110 chicks as some were unable to be handled. The percentage of returning birds oddly went up slightly from 37 to 40% with 14 arriving back, but the breeding success was also down. The total number of pairs nesting was down to 18 and this is the third year that this has happened.

The majority of ringed returning swallows were first handled last year (7) with the oldest from 2014 making this bird a seven year old! Just one in 2015, none from 2016, two from 2017 and three from 2018, but one was a chick ringed 1.6 km from the centre of Alfrick which then nested in Sandlin. This was a female and unusual as most ringed chicks are rarely caught again with many failing to make the long migration. The swallow needs to attempt at least two broods through the summer and very



occasionally three to produce enough replacements for the huge loss the chicks suffer, on a par with other birds such as blue tit and mallards.

There are 14 sites that are visited, but at 5 of them no birds nested even though swallows were seen visiting and even starting nests. At another place the nest remained hidden among the buildings. At the main site in Sandlin the reduction showed up there too with only 5 pairs whereas in 2017 there were 8 pairs in the many stables. It was here that two pairs came back to repeat last year's pairing and oddly each pair had consecutive ring numbers showing each pair was caught at the same time.




